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1. Introduction

This report is a summary of the community consultations held on December 11, 2015 to discuss the draft operational plan for the restoration of the O le Pupu Pu'e (OLPP) National Park. The restoration of the OLPP NP is a key activity in the Management Plan for the park (MNRE 2010). Preparation of the restoration plan for the OLPP NP, as well as the community consultation were funded under the GEF-PAS (Global Environment Facility - Pacific Alliance for Sustainability) Regional Invasive Species Management Project.

A separate document presents the actual operational plan for the restoration of the park.

2. Attendance List

Forty participants attended the consultation including representatives from the different village community groups (Alii ma Faipule (village matai), Sui o le malo/Pulenuu (official government representative), Sui Tamaitai (government representative for the women), Komiti o Tina (women's committee), and Tupulaga talavou (youth group) from each of the following three villages adjacent to the OLPP NP: Sa'aga, Saleilua and Poutasi. In addition, owners of beach fales and hotels in villages near the park also attended the consultation.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Uta'ileuo Kilisi (Saaga)

Q. Will the Government provide financial assistance for the communities who will be doing the job in removing the invasive plants, and do restoration within the park?

A. That is exactly what the consultant is trying to do. Try to find financial help from different sources so that the programme will succeed in achieving its target.

Sauluma Auvaa (Saleilua)

Q. As the National Park is rich in medicinal plants, can these plants be removed if needed for treatment?

A. No you cannot. It is against the law of the park. No plants can be removed from the park. If you want, the nurseries within the forestry can supply those seedlings for you, and it is your job to plant them for your personal use

Tuulau Solomona (Saleilua)

Q. i. Can a village like Saleilua apply for the water supply that comes from the national park to be privatised? ii. What exactly is our first priority- the renewable energy (biogas) or the removal of the vine? (fuelautele)

- A. i. No, they cannot, all the 3 villages should have a say in the matter
- ii. If we prioritise the biogas knowing that it's another way of controlling the vine, people will tend to grow the vine rather than removing it, so prioritise the eradication of the invasive plant.

Sina Tulitua (Saleilua)

Q. As mentioned, there is a chemical that can be injected in the plant so that it can kill the invasive species, can the government through its initiative provide that for every individual household?

- A. No, you buy your own

Nonu Meleisea (Poutasi)

Q. i. As I have gathered from the start, the park has covered quite a large area. Can the government lend 5 hectares for a new airport? ii. Is shooting bats in front of your own house an offence?

- A. i. First, there is no need for a new airport. By doing so, there will be a great risk to the biodiversity.
- ii. Yes, shooting bats in front of your own house is an offence. It's already being passed by the law under conservation.

Tu (Saaga)

Q. i. Can you get a reward if you report someone shooting bats? ii. Can the villages get cameras to photograph the offenders when caught?

- A. i. That is your share in conserving the national park
- ii. We have park rangers who are responsible for looking after the park

Uta'ileu (Saaga)

Q. Can we just kill the bats that are suitable? (big)

- A. We cannot do that. We can hardly differentiate them.

5. Next Steps

Vailega Timoteo Molesi from the South Upolu Forestry Office at Togitogiga summarised the main next steps for the project:

- Finalise Operational Plan by Jan 8 including budget and labour requirements
- Prepare funding proposals to implement project
- Hire Restoration Team
- Commence restoration work

6. Consultation Evaluation

An evaluation form was completed by 25 participants (see Annex 3). Overall the consultation was very well received by the participants. The full findings are shown below.


